Lincoln Reds hit high of 8,000 Guineas

Lincoln Red Bull Trade at the English Premier Pedigree Spring Show & Sale on Saturday 10th March 2018 at Newark stayed firm; with the highest priced Bull out of all four Breeds, Brackenhurst Viper taking 8,000 Gns. Placed 2nd in his Class of Senior Bulls; to Walmer Viborg; this Beverley Raider son is out of Brackenhurst Effie N355. Brackenhurst Viper was shown very successfully in 2017 (Junior, Male & Breed Champion at both Nottinghamshire & Lincolnshire Shows; Native Elite Junior Champion Bull at the Royal Welsh Show) by Nottingham Trent University; he sold to Michael Read's Hemingby Herd, Horncastle, Lincolnshire.



Brackenhurst Viper

Mr Needler's Senior & Supreme Champion Lincoln Red Bull, Walmer Viborg, Ranby, Lincolnshire; was 2nd highest priced Bull out of all the Breeds and sold for 7,000 Gns to Nick Barton's Highbarn Herd, Macclesfield Cheshire; sired by Market Stainton Norman (from R E Needham & Son's stable) out of Walmer Rose M11 (a Beverley Henchman daughter).

Reserve Senior Champion and Overall Reserve Champion Bull was Mrs S Buchan's, Ellon, Aberdeenshire; Auchmacoy Victor, out of Auchmacoy Lancelot and Auchmacoy Lass P121; sold to Rob & Sue Grace's, Trehudreth Herd in Cornwall to 3,500 Gns.

Junior Champion Bull, also from Mrs S Buchan's Auchmacoy Herd was Auchmacoy Vincent out of Auchmacoy Langworth and Auchmacoy Norah P105; sold to Mr J Gent's Stokedoyle Herd, Oundle, Peterborough, for 3,200 Gns.

Selling to 3,000Gns was Michael Read's Hemingby Vanguard out of Auchmacoy Oakley and Hemingby Treasure F216; to Mr J Capp's Handley Herd in Lincolnshire.

A total of 8 out of 10 bulls forward sold to an overall average of:
3,863 gns (3,356gns in 2017) £4,056 (£3,524 in 2017).

Top priced female and second highest in the Sale out of all the Breeds; Mr R Mawer's, Woodhall Spa, Lincolnshire, Supreme Champion Female, Premier Wispa W030, sired by St. Fort Stirling out of Yarn Hill Mary T296. This February 2017 Born Maiden Heifer sold to a Member in Norfolk for 2,800 Gns.

Reserve Champion Female was Emma Smith's, Huntingdon, Cambridgeshire, Houghton Vision V344, sired by Auchmacoy Oswald out of Lincsbells Hannah M104; this March 2016 born Maiden Heifer sold for 1,400 Gns to Izzi Rainey's Bates Moor Herd, Norfolk.

Second highest priced female was P & S Seller's, Thorpe Tilney, Lincolnshire (bred by C L Bembridge t/a Gilbert Farms) Anwick Hetty W10 sired by Market Stainton Scolar out of Anwick Hetty M9; this March 2017 born Maiden Heifer sold to Chris Page's Foulness Herd, Brough, East Yorkshire for 1,750 Gns.

Michael Read's February 2016 born Maiden Heifer, Hemingby Orchid V1033, sired by Beverley Senator out of Hemingby Orchid S869 sold to 1,250 Gns to Tom Green's Chestnut Tree Herd, Grantham, Lincolnshire.

Female trade was challenging and proved to be a Buyers' market with an overall average for 35 females sold of 1,027 Gns (1,549 Gns in 2017); £1,079 (£1,626 in 2017).

The winning Pen of a Pair of Heifers went to P & S Seller's, Sharlock Herd for their Maiden Heifers, bred by C L Bembridge t/a Gilbert Farms.

President, Martin Clough thanked Breed Judge, Richard McInnes; Auctioneer, Paul Gentry, and all the Team at Newark Livestock Market were thanked for their enthusiasm and contributions to the Show & Sale.
